Memorandum of Understanding

Miramonte H.S., Orinda Intermediate, Sleepy Hollow, Del Rey, Wagner Ranch & Glorietta Parents' Clubs (PARENTS' CLUBS)

Educational Foundation of Orinda (EFO-ONE)

This document describes the agreed-upon responsibilities and expectations between EFO-ONE (central organization) and PARENTS' CLUBS (school-specific fundraisers and program managers) in their mutual efforts to simplify the fundraising message, to create ONE donor base K through 12 and beyond and, most importantly, to generate more money to fund Orinda's schools in this increasingly challenging climate. The steps set forth in this document are intended to achieve a unified message, a "ONE Combined Ask," and a legal framework from which to start before the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year.

EFO-ONE is partnering with the six PARENTS' CLUBS through this proposed organizational structure. This structure contains four components: (1) fundraising goals; (2) banking structure and control of funds; (3) a shared database; and (4) risk sharing and administrative cost sharing.

This initial memorandum of understanding (INITIAL MOU) is intended to memorialize the main tenets agreed to by EFO-ONE and PARENTS' CLUBS. It will be the guiding document between June 2019 and December 1st, 2019, allowing the organizations to progress to the next step of developing a specific plan, including details crucial to the success of this model, notwithstanding the transitions in PCs' executive boards. Agreeing to the INITIAL MOU will not invalidate any one organization's ability to protest against future substantial deviations in this proposed structure.

1. FUNDRAISING GOALS:

ONE Combined Ask per child: Each PC will determine their ask by June of the previous school year. The Combined Ask is what EFO has traditionally funded, as well as that which the PC funds, both for personnel and other expenses. This ONE Combined Ask per Child will vary by school-site.

Common language, imagery: EFO-ONE will manage the process to rebrand itself, and in that process will develop a singular logo, and will write verbiage that all PCs may utilize. EFO-ONE will work with the OUSD & AUHSD Superintendents and Boards of Trustees to spread the message of ONE Orinda, and the State of California school funding issues we face as a community.

Transparency: PARENTS' CLUBS and EFO-ONE will work together to create an atmosphere of trust, transparency, and accountability. Accounting standards, audits, and public forum will all be methods to ensure full transparency.

2. BANKING STRUCTURE:

Each PC will have complete control and use of their accounts, which will reside under the umbrella EFO-ONE account. This will provide EFO-ONE with the sizeable backing it needs to attract community and corporate donations, while maintaining local autonomy of the PARENTS' CLUBS.

Periodically (i.e. 3 times per year) each PC will approve the release of their site's pledged funds to the OUSD and AUHSD, per their site's to-be-written annual personnel expenses agreement.

3. DATABASE:

EFO-ONE will maintain a database to track donations from the ONE Combined Ask by school. The system will enable both EFO-ONE and the relevant PC to access live donor data, including identifying families that have not yet donated. Both EFO-ONE and the PARENTS' CLUBS will be responsible for maintaining donor privacy. Parent donations, to more than one PC or directly to EFO-ONE, will be cumulatively tracked by family for leadership donor levels and benefits.

4. RISK SHARING AND ADMINISTRATIVE COST SHARING

EFO-ONE will continue to distribute community-raised funds and endowment proceeds on a prorata basis across all Orinda school sites. These funds, as they do now, are intended to cover the shortfall between parent donations and the pledged personnel & electives expenses for each school.

EFO-ONE will contribute a portion of community raised and other funds towards administrative and overhead costs. **PARENTS' CLUBS will commit to split the remaining cost of EFO-ONE overhead on a per-student basis.** The overhead costs of EFO-ONE will be determined by the new EFO-ONE Executive Board.

ASSIGNMENTS/RESPONSIBILITIES

EFO-ONE

EFO, a nonprofit based in Orinda, California, will be rebranded to become the central face of educational funding in Orinda. The EFO bylaws will be revised to accommodate the following:

- An Executive Board made up of a voting representative from each PC, and a voting member of the "Community Board of Advisors," see below.
- A Community Board of Advisors tasked with community outreach and Orinda-wide events; the chairperson of this Advisory Board also sits on the Executive Board

EFO-ONE will develop the marketing, verbiage and communications plan, with the assistance of PCs.

EFO-ONE will manage the opening and structure of the new, necessary bank accounts.

EFO-ONE will engage volunteers or employees to assist with administrative functions such as database management, and to assist PCs in managing and expanding corporate matching efforts.

PARENTS' CLUBS

The PARENTS' CLUBS, all nonprofits based in Orinda, California, will each revise their bylaws in the course of this process to accommodate the following:

- Process to appoint a current/ former executive member to the new EFO-ONE Executive Board
- Allow for new banking structure & new pledging model to OUSD through EFO-ONE

LIABILITY COVERAGE/PROTECTION

Each PC and EFO-ONE will maintain individual insurance policies sufficient to insulate each from any liability or debt incurred by another organization.

Meeting purpose updating information for progress and transition of EFO, various proposals to work toward centralization and shared partnership in management of budgets.

Review of state funding, share of increasing expenses was discussed. Start of Fundraising Task Force created 2016 by Dr Seaton. Research of Comparable Districts and the decision was made decision to change fundraising and need for transition and new organization for EFO.

Question becomes how to raise more from outside resources. Solution was to hire Executive Director (ED) late 2018. Fundraising work under the new ED has begun.

Need the schools to come together, unify resources, engage new donors, create partnership, and grow our funding pool. Discussions began for potential solutions and a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been created to include all 6 schools in Orinda. The next step will be to agree upon and vote to approve signing the MOU.
