Bandit Update - Hester

- Current Bandit movie policy is as follows:
 - Movies on smoky/poor air quality and rainy days
 - Movies on Friday starting at 7:15am for morning students who typically are not at Bandit in the afternoon, 1:10 cartoons, and 2:00pm feature film
 - Concerns regarding tv/movies being played all day on Friday were discussed, however due to the range of schedules of kids attending, no solution for minimizing or changing the current Friday movie-day was agreed upon. Several board members value having kids who are excited to be in Bandit on Fridays because of the movies.
- Enrichment coordinator
 - Hester took over this role in 2017 as it was too much for work/coordination for parent volunteer and receives stipend for this work. It makes sense for Hester to do so as she must coordinate space for the vendors and keep track of the students attending.
- o Spanish coordinator
 - Hester noted that increased coordination will be required next year and is to receive stipend for assuming responsibilities.
 - Role will include:
 - Unlocking classrooms
 - Keeping track of students who attend Spanish classes and ensuring students are released on time for regular class
 - Disciplining/time-out for disruptive students so that class is not affected by disruptive student.
 - Ensuring communication about field trips and minimum days.

Principal's Report – Jim Manheimer Updates:

- Enrollment 2019-20 so far in class numbers: TK (1), K&1st (7), 2nd (3), 3rd(4), 4th (2), 5th (2), 4&5 (1), SDC(1)
- o 2 more teachers will need to be hired for fall.
- o School Climate Survey to be sent out soon hoping for 60-70% return.
- o Recent purchases:
 - o 1st grade basketball hoop is to be delivered soon
 - o 13 MacAirs for teachers
- Summer Development participation: Cathy Cambell at SVMI (Silicon Valley Math Initiative), Shauna Yeager at Orton Gillingham, J.Manheimer at ACSA
- o 5th grade physical fitness to occur next week. 95% participation required.
- o Revolutionary War alternate to water balloons to be researched
- Girls' Talk scheduled for 4th grade girls to address "cliquey-ness" issues/conflicts. A.Hatton suggested that these talks might be effective if started earlier in 2nd and 3rd grades.
- CAASPP testing- in progress with 5th grade completed.
- Green Team Health inspector requested change to utensil collection method, but in general students are proud of efforts.
- o Garden plots in progress.

 - o Incorporate Innovation Lab as a regular part of curriculum
