Update:

<u>Power outages</u>: parent emails were very positive: staff learned a lot and things went smoothly. The biggest vulnerability was communication. The technician came out an improved service with the walkie talkies. There are now walkie talkies in every classroom. Can Bandit club get a landline?

Emergency procedures: earthquake, fire, secure campus: school is well prepared. A lot has been done with the controlled burn. The MPR (multi-purpose room) is built to be very fire resistant. There is also a water tower next to the MPR. All kids would go into the MPR and the fire dept. will designate a truck for each Orinda school. Parents need to STAY AWAY for safety. Parents should get on Hwy 24 and get out of town. The fire department and/or police will advise which way will be best. We need to get this information out to new families.

In an earthquake parents can come but they might not be able to get their kids for a while. First Aid and response will be first priority.

<u>Site Council:</u> No Place for Hate – Staff has been trained. The work will go into the classrooms next year.

<u>Summit Counseling:</u> is up and running- Niva and Jim form groups depending on recommendations given by the teachers. 20 kids per session are served. In the second session new kids will be added.

New Handbook- Now online after a great deal of change and thought.

<u>EBMUD projects</u>: 5 EBMUD projects will be occurring over the next 5 years. Easy to work with they. Jim had a meeting regarding WR and they are ready to provide crossing guards when they are actively doing a project that affects our school grounds. They are going to do some work on the vegetation, so visibility is better. They're going to fix the stoplights. Jim is also pushing for a curb or division to make the bike path clearer (esp. near Miner Rd.). They will not take ownership for the degradation of the hill at Wagner.
